Bert Delisle – Oneway Lathe Drill

The Oneway lathe drill fits in the 1 inch tool rest post hole. The device can hold a portable drill or some small routers. Bert demonstrated how to set up the device perpendicular to the

piece being drilled and then moved to the drill location. The lathe indexing feature can be used to symmetrically drill the holes. Bert showed a board game he made with drilled holes for colored plugs whose location must be memorized to win the game. Thank you Bert for the demo
